

KENYA – TSAVO to MAASAI MARA 2008

'In this country of endless wonder, this year's participants found that even a two-week tour of Kenya offers a wealth of discovery, with new birds appearing from the tour's start right up to our final morning in the Maasai Mara. An impressive 517 species of birds were seen and a minor total of 10 species were heard only, for a total of 527 forms recorded by members of this fortunate group. These totals included five storks, 37 birds of prey, nine hornbills, 11 barbets, six owls (including all four species of eagle-owls), 16 cisticolas, 19 sunbirds, 16 starlings and 15 *Ploceus* weavers. There were also 60 species of mammals (excluding a few unidentified bats, shrews and rodents), 20 identified reptiles and amphibians, plus a few frogs that got away, and a host of butterflies and dragonflies, not to mention the fascinating botanical fauna. The whole was just too much to take in!

All of this was experienced in the seclusion of luxurious lodges deep in the heart of prime birding country, offering not only comfort but the finest food that anyone could hope to find in the wilds of any country on this planet. Still the superlatives come: the most scenic, the friendliest people, the easiest place to see birds and wildlife, the most comfortable of climates imaginable – all have been uttered by the participants on this trip. Despite the negative publicity generated by political unrest earlier in the year, the participants found in Kenya the most peaceful of nations ready to welcome them and make them feel at home.

This year we experienced some contrasts in weather, which was mainly comfortable but also a little chilly in the mornings at Amboseli. Drought was being experienced throughout, and much of what would have been a "normal" season just was not experienced. We saw very little of anything resembling rain throughout the tour.

On our first morning we headed off with a picnic for the short drive to Nairobi National Park, the first introduction to East African birding for most in the group. While waiting for the tickets to be issued at the park entrance, we found colorful jewels such as Variable and Scarlet-chested Sunbirds, as well as Holub's Golden and Baglafaecht Weavers. Noisy White-browed Sparrow-Weavers were in the car-park, and comical Speckled Mousebirds were creeping through the bushes. Our first mammal for the tour was a cluster of attractive Peter's Epauletted Fruit-Bats roosting at the entrance gate. Once inside the park the sight of ponderous Black Rhinos, stately Maasai Giraffes, and grassy horizons dotted with gazelles and ostriches reminded the group where they were. One group member had over a hundred new species of birds on this first day, and had no idea that things were only going to get better! Following our full day, a very tasty meal capped the promise of a good night's rest.

Under a light cloud cover, we departed through Nairobi traffic for our first stop on the long drive to Tsavo West National Park. This was a pleasant walk at the foot of the Lukenya Hills east of the capital. Many species were encountered here, in a mixture of highland and lowland forms. Grey-capped Social Weavers were the most numerous species present, busily engaged in nesting activities. Banded Parisomas were both vocal and readily visible, but many species remained in cover, as it was a bit on the cool side. A stately Verreaux's Eagle patrolled the rocky crags for luckless Hyrax, and a pair of Lanners cackled along the edge of the cliff. We were fortunate to locate Southern Grosbeak Canary on the walk back, as we would not encounter this species again. Lunch at Hunter's Lodge was a pleasant experience, with kingfishers of three species distracting us from our meal, and after this refuel we continued on to Tsavo West. Near the museum just inside the gate at Mtito Andei we stirred up a large group of birds assisted by the local Pearl-spotted Owlets. This gave us an excellent experience with the dry-country species, and amongst the birds here we had fiery Orange-bellied Parrots, comical Von der Decken's Hornbills, noisy Crested Francolins and busy Hildebrandt's Starlings. Continuing along the road we stopped for Black-headed Plovers and a perched Golden-breasted Starling. As we neared Ngulia with evening falling, a Spotted Eagle-Owl perched on a tree near a lava flow. A Leopard appeared prior to dinner, bringing

the excited group members to the forecourt prematurely, and several Greater Galagos came to their feeding tray. Elephants were busy at the small pond 10 metres away from the observers. After dinner we retired to bed and rested, readying ourselves for the excitements of the next day.

After an early breakfast we set off down the escarpment into the thornscrub below. The lack of rains had left the area quite arid with many bushes leafless, which was unusual at this time of year. It was quite a challenge finding birds that were loath to sing or show themselves, but with perseverance the species fell one by one. By the time we returned for lunch we had seen virtually all of the area's residents. Star performers included no less than three groups of Scaly Chatterers sitting in low scrub, a few Pale Prinias, a species from the north which is increasing in this area, a group of dapper White Helmet-shrikes and, with persistence, wonderful views of obliging Red-naped Bush-Shrikes, a species that is rarely seen and easily overlooked. In the afternoon we had a local drive, encountering a good assortment of species. The best of these were Grey-Olive Greenbuls heard in a wooded valley, although it was too late in the day to see them. That evening we were visited by another Leopard.

The next morning, after another early breakfast punctuated by visitations from local avian residents, we set off to locate the greenbuls heard the previous evening. Armed with a pre-recording, we had superb views of an agitated pair of this our rarest of greenbul species. This constituted a new species for the already impressive Tsavo National Park list. From here we headed westward to Amboseli National Park, stopping along the way for a picnic after calling in an inquisitive Red-winged Lark and seeing elegant Taita Fiscal. Just before joining the main road, we stopped at a small wood to find Brown-hooded Kingfishers, another pair of Grey-olive Greenbuls, rather introvert Red-capped Robin-Chat, and friendlier Black-throated Wattle-eyes. Soon we arrived at Amboseli and saw our first Elephants of the day. After a scrumptious meal we adjourned to the lounge to formalize the day's extensive wildlife list, and then retired for a very comfortable night.

Our full day in Amboseli the next day proved to be a magical experience. We were surprised to find both Little and Dwarf Bitterns associating with the commoner marshland species. Southern Rush Warblers, at the southern extremity of their range, came to see the group in a marshy area where comical Black Crakes strode across the floating vegetation. Recent rains had sustained an area of swamp not far from the lodge but other areas were quite low, not having fully recovered from the recent drought. Nevertheless we saw the world's largest heron, the Goliath Heron, noisy and attractive African Fish-Eagles yodelling from the remnant trees adjacent to the water, Two-banded Courser piping from the barren dusty landscape, Malachite Kingfishers waiting patiently on papyrus stems and White-headed Buffalo-Weavers launching clumsily to reveal their red rumps. Toward the main gate we found Buff-crested Bustards, gaudy Rosy-patched Bush-Shrikes and no less than seven Pygmy Falcons. Amongst the mammals we were also treated to Hippos, Elephants, Giraffe and the unusual Gerenuk. After a sumptuous meal we ventured out again in the afternoon. The very local Taveta Golden Weavers were in the car-park of the grounds and, with the help of a Pearl-spotted Owlet, we called up an assortment of other arboreal species. On our drive around the marsh we were treated to seeing African Jacanas skittering over the floating vegetation, and beautiful Crowned Cranes responding with a quick two-step, followed by their offspring mimicking their parents' every move. Mount Kilimanjaro did not favour us by raising its misty veil until late evening, but the evening star show was spectacular.

The following morning, after finding a pair of cryptic Spotted Thick-knee, we flew to Nanyuki via Nairobi. After a delicious cappuccino we were transferred to Mountain Lodge, arriving in time for a wholesome lunch. We spent the remainder of the day birding from the rooftop, seeing a good variety of birds both in the bushes and passing overhead. Mammals such as Buffalo and Bushbuck came and went, along with smaller forest inhabitants like pestilent Syke's Monkeys, and lesser species like Large-spotted Genets and White-tailed Mongooses.

The variety of birds kept the group entertained, as numbers of impressive Silvery-cheeked Hornbills honked from the trees, Red-fronted Parrots flew in to preen before sunset and, in the evening, a very unseasonal Green Sandpiper came in to roost.

The next day we drove up Mt. Kenya to the meteorological station at 10,000 feet. Here we saw several very attractive Abyssinian Ground-Thrushes and sparkling Tacazze Sunbirds around the cabins. A tame Hill Chat watched us devour our picnic, but the endemic Jackson's Francolin was elusive and we left thinking that we were not to be graced by a sighting. But only two kilometres from the gate – far below the normal elevation for the species – we had two sitting by the road! The group was shown a whole host of sub-alpine plants, many in genera familiar to them. An attractive terrestrial orchid is yet to be identified, and Edwin's usually sharp eyes located a Jackson's Forest Lizard on a tree trunk. By late afternoon we were back on the roof-top finding a few more new species and remaining until dark, when the nocturnal mammals put in their appearances – along with *two* Green Sandpipers!

We woke to a clear morning, enabling us to appreciate the impressive view of Mt. Kenya's alpine zone, the summit clothed in fresh snow. We departed at a slow pace, finding many new species along the roadside, the rarest being a Lemon Dove that nearly hit the car and then sat on a low branch and preened, maybe recovering from the close encounter. Moustached Green Tinkerbird left the high canopy to challenge the group from a clump of mistletoe, and many Hartlaub's Turacos were active and showy, gliding across clearings on their intensely crimson wings. Finally arriving for lunch at Naro Moru River Lodge, we had a short rest before driving along the road bisecting Solio Ranch. Numerous mammals were evident, including Beisa Oryx, Jackson's Hartebeeste and Eland.

We traversed the same route the next morning, a nice surprise being a Greater Kestrel on one of the few trees. Our next stop was a visit to an incubating Mackinder's Eagle-Owl, which glared at us from a rock face on the other side of a quarry. At Ndaragwa we found some secretive Abyssinian Crimsonwings and a Von Hoemel's Chameleon. Some African Water Rails put on a fine show at a nearby swamp, where we were fortunate to find White-backed Duck. With our picnic at Thomson Falls, we located a group of Slender-billed Starlings and very tame Yellow-bellied Waxbills. In Subukia one of the most beautiful of weavers, Jackson's Golden-backed, was busy nest-building in some reeds and a colorful Battersby's Green Snake was a real poser for photographs. We continued on to Lake Baringo and caught a boat for a smooth transfer to the Island for our overnight. A Barn Owl visited after dinner, and Senegal Thick-knees could be heard calling like demented Whimbrels.

At dawn, Little Weavers raced for the morning wake-up biscuits before we could get to them, and after breakfast we took a detour in the boat to easily locate a group of seven Senegal Thick-knees along a beach. At the jetty we found impressive Giant Kingfisher and dazzling Woodland Kingfishers. Whilst bouncing along the rough track, multi-hued White-throated Bee-eaters danced around the acacias. We patrolled the nearby cliffs and woodland, finding Bristle-crowned Starlings, watchful White-faced Scops Owls, teetering Brown-tailed and bouncy Cliff Chats. With local assistance of the resident junior birder, we were able to appreciate Greyish Eagle-Owl, Heuglin's Courser and Slender-tailed Nightjar all at their day-time retreats. After lunch we departed for Nakuru, enjoying Silverbird and several Leopard Tortoises on the way. Words cannot convey the magical spectacle of Lake Nakuru's Lesser Flamingos in the first rays of sunlight heralding the new day, but this year they were outnumbered by the equally colorful Great White Pelicans in their orange-flushed breeding dress. The settling ponds held a good variety of ducks and waterbirds, and swifts and swallows were also attracted. The woodlands offered their own variety of birds, with Scaly-throated and Greater Honeyguides, Red-throated Wryneck and the very local Grey-crested Helmet-Shrikes.

In the morning we looked in the gardens prior to breakfast. An endearing Little Rock Thrush hopped along the path, Hildebrandt's Francolins were successfully coaxed out of their heavily vegetated retreats, and very sluggish Northern Puffbacks were motionless until the sun warmed them. Our final new destination was the incomparable Maasai Mara, which required a day of travelling punctuated with roadside stops for more new species such as bouncing Banded and White-chinned Prinias, curious Grey-throated Barbet and sentinel Mackinnon's Fiscal. We descended into the Maasai Mara and finally arrived somewhat tenderized at Kichwa Tembo, and soon we were ridding ourselves of the day's grime in well-appointed and comfortable surroundings. An exceptional meal soon followed.

We had an early morning walk in the garden of the lodge prior to breakfast, finding Ross's Turaco, White-browed Robin-Chat and beautiful sprite-like Blue Flycatchers, amongst an impressive variety of species. On the grassy swath in front of the fence there was a great array of plains mammals including Elephant, Wildebeest and Giraffe. After this we visited the nearby Sabaringo Valley and Oloololo Escarpment. With some effort the area's specialties were found, and a walk along the edge of the escarpment provided a stunning view overlooking the Maasai Mara and the winding Mara River far below us. Here we discovered the fluorescent Mwanza Flat-headed Agama. After lunch we spent the afternoon at the Serena Oxbow Swamps, where a variety of waders and herons were found as well as a comical family of Ground Hornbills.

We took another early morning walk around the camp before breakfast and then set off for our long drive across the Mara. An amazing find here was the discovery of the first Olive-bellied Sunbird recorded in the Mara, and the second discovery of the morning was a group of three Short-necked Skinks, the first ever recorded west of the Great Rift in Kenya. We also located a number of special western species such as Rufous-bellied Heron, Wattled Plover, Schalow's Turaco, Bare-faced Go-Away Bird, Usambiro Barbet and Sooty Chat.

The next morning we had a sortie into a local valley, here finding Buff-bellied Penduline-Tit (this gave us a Penduline-Tit hat-trick – not an easy accomplishment), Magpie Shrikes at their only Kenyan location, Tabora Cisticola and dazzling Marico Sunbirds. Amongst the large variety of species, many were now starting to become familiar – and it was time to leave!

We boarded our flight back to Nairobi, saying farewell to Edwin who had a long overland journey ahead of him. Not only had Edwin chauffeured the group safely around central Kenya, but he was a veritable mine of information on all aspects of Kenyan life, as well as a very capable birder and all-round naturalist with extremely sharp eyes, as he demonstrated on so many occasions. We suffered no car problems until the last day, when we broke a U-bolt while making our way toward a group of concealed lions. This caused us no hindrance, and was fixed before Edwin left the Mara to meet up with us for our last meal in Nairobi.

It had been a very successful tour, and it was difficult to absorb all that we had seen in a mere two weeks covering just a small part of Kenya'. - *Brian Finch*
