

SOUTH AFRICA – Kalahari to the Cape

'After gathering everyone together at Upington, and sorting the vehicles out, we began the tour with a drive north towards the Kalahari, with a brief pause on the banks of the Orange River in Upington. The drive gave us some of our first typical sights of the region with Southern Pale Chanting Goshawks keeping watch from roadside poles, dinky Pygmy Falcons and massive Sociable Weaver nests. The newly paved road made the very early drive into the Kalahari reserve much easier and although our usual route inside the Kalahari Reserve was closed for repair, we still managed to find a waterhole with good numbers of Namaqua Sandgrouse and a few Burchell's Sandgrouse coming to drink. A pair of Southern White-faced Scops Owls roosting in a bush were a real find and several Bateleurs, a couple of Secretary Birds, Swallow-tailed Bee-eaters, Kalahari Scrub-Robins, stunning Crimson-breasted Shrikes, hordes of Scaly-feathered Finches, Marico and Chat Flycatchers, 3 sleepy Cheetahs and a fine male Lion were some of the other highlights here. Outside of the reserve, there were lots of Northern Black Korhaans, Lilac-breasted Rollers, and a very responsive Pearl-spotted Owlet to look at.

We found Groundscraper Thrush in the grounds of our guest house before heading back south. The journey back was broken with stops for Eastern Clapper Larks and a visit to Augrabies, where birds ranged from tiny African Reed Warblers to a Goliath Heron. Alpine Swifts swarmed around the gorge above the falls, and in the camp site we found a Golden-tailed Woodpecker and a pair of Pirit Batis. We had a very successful time around Pofadder with all the larks showing well. These included the often elusive Stark's and Sclater's Larks and regulars like Red Lark, all contributing to a grand total of 16 lark species for the tour. We also did very well for Ludwig's Bustards here and the 3 Burchell's Coursers were a real treat, nicely complementing the Double-banded Coursers seen earlier. We had superb views of a Martial Eagle right overhead.

There were some spectacular flowers in the Namaqua Reserve which broke the long drive to Lambert's Bay, where the famous fish restaurant was as welcoming as ever. The Cape Gannets were down in number but still pretty impressive and we saw the first of many other seabird species here. Leaving the coast we headed back inland and stopped at a small wetland to get very good views of Little Rush and Lesser Swamp warblers, as well as more colourful Red Bishops and Cape Weavers. From there we followed dirt roads along the coast, stopping at the Berg River Estuary where a variety of waterbirds were on show, including both Great and Lesser Flamingos, lots of waders and huge numbers of Cape Cormorants. A quick visit to Marcus Island gave us a perched Spotted Eagle Owl, some close Bank Cormorants and African Black Oystercatchers. This was followed by a visit to the West Coast Nature Reserve where we found our two main targets – Black and African Marsh Harriers and discovered some Black Crakes at a small wetland. There were some stunning flowers and views down the Atlantic coast to admire here as well before we were off again towards the karoo, making a few stops for such delights as our first Blue Cranes and Orange-throated Longclaw.

From our comfortable base in the Cedarberg Mountains we were able to venture out into the vast karoo in search of Black-eared Sparrowlark, Rufous-eared Warbler, Namaqua Warbler, Fairy Flycatcher, and Pirit Batis. An (almost) silent night time vigil in a narrow gorge was rewarded with a Cape Eagle Owl, flying over calling and perched while the following morning not far from this site we finally caught up with some obliging Cinnamon-breasted Warblers. Moving on towards Swellendam we stopped in Paarl where the sewage ponds gave us a variety of waterfowl including a brief Little Bittern, White-faced Whistling Duck and Hottentot Teal. The Bontebok Reserve not only held good numbers of the eponymous antelope but also several Stanley's Bustards, some in full display, Agulhas Clapper Larks, also displaying, Pearl-breasted Swallows, Fiscal Flycatchers, Greater Double-collared Sunbird, and Brimstone Canary to mention a few. The drive south took us through a rolling agricultural landscape where we saw many more Blue Cranes, some very close Cape Vultures and, eventually,

Agulhas Long-billed Larks. Lunch at Potberg gave us Olive Woodpecker and Lesser Honeyguide before we left for our final destination – Cape Town.

The Cape Town weather proved to be as fickle as ever and we took the chance of what was likely to be our best day to do a pelagic on our first day. In the end the conditions proved to be too much for some and we turned back. A hastily arranged second pelagic on the last day at least gave some the chance to see a variety of petrels and albatrosses. Back on dry land we caught up with Cape Rockjumper over at Betty's Bay, where we also had superb views of a normally elusive Victorin's Warbler obligingly sitting still for the 'scope, and where we visited the African penguin colony at Stony Point. There were also some good views of Southern Right Whales as well on the drive round. Back on the other side of False Bay, in Cape Point Nature Reserve we found a patch of flowering Protea bushes with attendant Cape Sugarbirds, and Orange-breasted and Malachite Sunbirds while close to our accommodation there were Grassbirds, Cape Siskins and a nice fly-past from a Black Sparrowhawk. Elsewhere there was Forest Buzzard and Cape Batis in Constantia, African Goshawk in the lodge garden, and masses of waterbirds in Strandfontein sewage farm, while a wander around the gardens at Kirstenbosch gave us a dozing Spotted Eagle Owl, Cinnamon Dove, Black Sawwing, numerous Sombre Greenbuls, and more encounters with Cape Sugarbirds on Protea bushes.'
